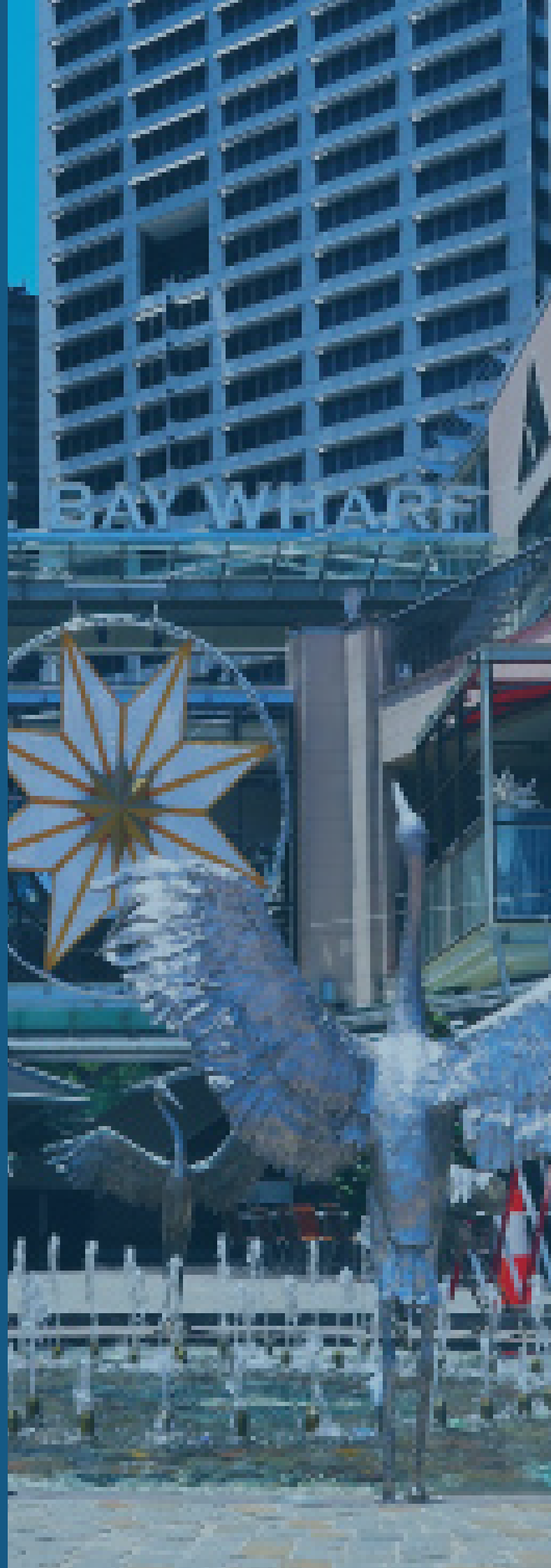

VAUCLUSE HOUSE

One of Sydney's only surviving 19th-century harbourside estates dating back to 1803. This estate is surrounded by 10 hectares of picturesque gardens and grounds stretching down to Sydney Harbour.



COCKLE BAY WHARF

In 1998, as Darling Harbour celebrated its 10th birthday, Cockle Bay Wharf was constructed. The following year massive works were undertaken in preparation for the Sydney 2000 Olympic Games.

In 2000, Darling Harbour hosted five sports during the Olympic Games and construction of King Street Wharf was completed.



ELIZABETH FARM

This small, solid three-roomed brick cottage in the Australian Old Colonial style was transformed into a small country house in the late 1820s. The early cottage remains intact, making it Australia's oldest surviving European dwelling.



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
